

April Recap- Cultural Competence: Changing the Public Face of Public Relations

Dr. Ruth White, a 33-year educator and former director of the Commission on the Status of African Americans for the State of Iowa, challenged us as PR professionals to develop "cultural competence" – an understanding of the increasingly diverse community with which we seek to communicate and build relationships. This requires learning about others in order to expand ourselves, rather than merely trying to accommodate differing viewpoints.


To work effectively in the context of a diverse community, she said, we must go beyond surface-level distinctions in areas such as the arts, religion, music, dress and cooking to understand deeper aspects of cultural and ethnic diversity. Examples are differences in communication styles, conceptions of beauty, patterns of handling emotion, conceptions of time, and patterns of superior/subordinate relationships – all of which play a role in media representations and how they are received by various groups of people.
